Alexandre (Sacha) Trudeau joins the QUEST: Filmmaker & Journalist Key-Note at University of Winnipeg's War-Affected Children Conference

WINNIPEG—It's been five years since the International Conference on War-Affected Children in Winnipeg. The goal? To move the international community to action.

Yet in the last decade alone, more than two million children have died as a result of war and some 15 million children have been displaced within their countries or made refugees. But are the rights of children better protected today and is Canada fulfilling its responsibility on the foreign policy and domestic fronts?
