### **UWinnipeg Vice-President (Students) Cull heads to UBC Okanagan**

WINNIPEG—University of Winnipeg President and Vice-Chancellor Lloyd Axworthy announced today that Vice-President (Students) Ian Cull has been appointed to the position of Vice President, Students at UBC Okanagan effective September 1, 2005.

Working with a dedicated team, Cull guided a number of exciting projects within the University of Winnipeg's Enrolment and Student services. During his tenure, a time of rapid expansion in student enrolment at UWinnipeg, the Aboriginal Student Services Centre opened and the groundwork was laid for a forthcoming student information system.

In his new role at UBC Okanagan, Cull will be responsible for a diverse range of student services, including student development and advising, aboriginal programs and services, athletics and recreation, career development and alumni relations, and campus health and wellness.

Cull previously served as Dean of Students at St. Francis Xavier University in Antigonish, Nova Scotia from 1997 to 2002. His responsibilities included services for Aboriginal students, international students, career services, and financial aid. As Director of Counselling Services at Lakehead University in Thunder Bay, Ontario from 1989 to 1997, Cull was responsible for counseling and career centre operations and native student support services.

Cull, MA, BA (Hons.) Clinical Psychology, BA (Hons.) Anthropology, leaves his post as Vice-President (Students) August, 2005.
