## *No Offense*: Acerbic New Comedy Heats up Winnipeg Winter

WINNIPEG— The University of Winnipeg's Department of Theatre and Film stages its second production of the 2005/06 theatre season with *No Offense*, by Winnipeg playwright Michael Nathanson (Collegiate '84, BA Hons. '91). The new play was penned especially for this UWinnipeg Acting III: Honours Class. Following last year's hilarious success with *City of Destiny*, this year's *No Offense* marks the second consecutive year in which Nathanson has geared his writing to accommodate a specific group.

*No Offense*—running February 7 – 11, 2006 at the Gas Station Theatre—takes a biting comedic look at the consequences of our overly polite, "no offense" society. In his new play, Nathanson examines what transpires when we have so much to say but lack the ability to actually communicate the truth. People with delicate sensibilities should stay far away from this play. No offense.

The Assistant Director for *No Offense* is Stephanie Plaitin. Set and costumes are designed by Lisa Hancharek. Lighting Design is by Jerry Augustin. This fully-mounted show is produced with technical support from senior production students in the UWinnipeg Department of Theatre and Film.

Nathanson is the author of 12 plays including Fringe Festival hit *I Took Your Name* (Top Pick by the Montreal Gazette and a juried selection in the New York International Fringe Festival). Working with long-time dramaturge and director Per Brask, Nathanson tackled the daunting task of creating a play for 13 actors in *No Offense*. Having such a large cast allowed him to deal with such diverse storylines as the dissolution of friendship, a theatre company's struggle with on-stage nudity, and an alternative newspaper's interview with a contentious figure.

Performances take place <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 7 through Saturday</u>, <u>February 11 at 8:00 p.m. nightly</u> at the Gas Station Theatre, 445 River Avenue. Admission is free but reservations are recommended.
