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UWinnipeg Theatre Season Opens with Hilarious Feminist Farce By GG Award Winning Playwright Ann-Marie MacDonald

WINNIPEG— The University of Winnipeg opens its 2005/06 theatre season **November 22, 2005** with Ann-Marie MacDonald's Governor General's Award-winning play, *Goodnight Desdemona (Good Morning Juliet)*. The play will be performed by the Fourth-Year Honours Acting – Style and Genre class with technical support from senior production students.

Goodnight Desdemona (Good Morning Juliet) is an outrageously humorous trip through the mind of Constance Ledbelly, a Shakespearian scholar on the fringes of life. Seeking her own identity, Ledbelly discovers a mysterious manuscript believed to be the original source for *Romeo and Juliet*, as well as *Othello*, and enters a world peopled by the characters from these plays. *Goodnight Desdemona* abounds with twists, fights, dances, seductions, and wild surprises.

Goodnight Desdemona (Good Morning Juliet) was Ann-Marie MacDonald's first solo flight as playwright, and since its premier in 1988 it has been performed continually in Canada, the United States, Great Britain, and Japan, and is widely studied in drama courses. This post-modern farce with layers of feminism, wit, humour, and profundity has received rave reviews:
