- **Dr. Alan Katz**, Family Medicine and Manitoba Centre for Health Policy, University of Manitoba, with the clinical research perspective; and,
- **Jennifer Howard** of Winnipeg's Women's Health Clinic, who will speak on the patient advocacy perspective.
