UWinnipeg's 5th Annual Student Film Festival Welcomes New Media

WINNIPEG—The University of Winnipeg's 5th Annual Student Film Festival wrapped up April 27, 2007 with a lively discussion about new media and a celebration of well-deserving award-winners. A province-wide invitation for submissions to post-secondary filmmakers once again provided a high level of competition with exciting and innovative films ranging from documentaries and animated shorts to comedies and hard-hitting dramas.

This year's event, held April 25-27 at The University of Winnipeg, attracted 68 film submissions from 41 student filmmakers from the University of Manitoba, Red River College and The University of Winnipeg. Festival highlights included the screening of 33 films selected by a committee of three local film instructors and filmmakers; the world premiere of Till Death do us Part, a half-hour noir drama produced by senior UWinnipeg flmmakers; Special Guest Shereen Jerrett who screened some of her work while talking about the emergence of filmmaking on the internet and other new media topics; and a gala awards ceremony and lively closing reception celebrating the achievements of new and emerging student filmmakers.

This year's Awards Jury was comprised of *Danishka Esterhazy*, a local writer and director whose films have been shown at festivals around the world; *Dave Barber*, the programmer for *Cinematheque*; and *Tara Walker*, Executive Director of Manitoba Motion Picture Industry Association (MMPIA.)
