UWinnipeg's Religion & Life Week 2007: Security and Spirituality—Religious Life in a Post 9/11 World

WINNIPEG— Members of different faiths will explore the notion of security —including security of faith in a secular world, political security, security of minority groups and security against the fear of the unknown—during Religion and Life Week 2007 taking place next week at The University of Winnipeg.

Against the backdrop of 9/11, shootings at Dawson College and at the Amish school in Pennsylvania, speakers will address how one lives a religious or spiritual life in a society where people's lives can be threatened at any time in the most unexpected ways.
